





Close family, friends, colleagues and Dr. Gunn's beloved dog, Joey, gathered to honor his gift to the university at the Veterinary Technology building on campus in October 2019.

“The Campaign Cabinet is a very committed group of community leaders who have worked diligently to meet this campaign goal and ensure the future success of Texas A&M-Kingsville,” remarked Gene Dawson Jr., Campaign Chair. “While we are thrilled that we have passed the goal ahead of schedule, our campaign is not finished. We want to keep going to provide this university with the best possible resources for its students, faculty and staff. We are grateful for the alumni and friends of Texas A&M-Kingsville that have joined the effort and look forward to accomplishing even more in this campaign moving forward.”

With the generosity of the holiday season now accounted for, the campaign tallies \$100,915,988 in gifts and commitments, with 4,970 alumni, faculty, students and friends of the university donating and participating in the effort.

Dedicated donor and alumnus, Dr. Tom Russell, has generously given to Texas A&M-Kingsville for several decades. At the end of December 2019, Dr. Russell contributed \$80,000 toward the Ralph C. Russell Accounting Scholarship Endowment, which was the last cash gift made to the Foundation for the calendar year. That substantial gift is responsible for exceeding



the \$100 Million benchmark and joins a plethora of support he has given toward Texas A&M-Kingsville in honor of his father, Ralph Russell, who was a longtime beloved professor of accounting at our university.

“Donating gives a more ready source of funds to the university and its people, associations and groups so that when they want to do something, they don’t have to wait to accomplish what it is they need to do,” stated Dr. Russell. “I taught for 15 years and saw the difficulty with administration being unable to provide funding quickly toward ideas. I’m glad that alumni and local businesses are being educated on just what their donations can do for the university.”

Dr. Russell also believes that by giving, he can impact the accounting program in its ability to produce the high caliber education that he fondly remembers during his father’s tenure with the department, with students earning remarkable success in their careers post-graduation.

TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY-KINGSVILLE FOUNDATION TO RECEIVE \$19M BEQUEST

LARGEST IN UNIVERSITY'S HISTORY

The Texas A&M University-Kingsville Foundation announced, with gratitude, the largest singular gift from an individual in the university's almost 100-year history. The \$19.5 million bequest is also the leading commitment to date for the university's first comprehensive fundraising campaign, *With You. Without Limits. The Campaign for Texas A&M University-Kingsville.*

Given by an anonymous donor, the transformational gift will include more than 7,800 acres of Texas ranchland, presently valued at \$16 million, plus \$3.5 million in cash – all dedicated to King Ranch® Institute for Ranch Management (KRIRM).

“Texas A&M University-Kingsville is honored to receive this tremendous gift that will have a significant impact on the King Ranch® Institute for Ranch Management. Through this donor’s immense generosity, our students, faculty and researchers will be able to expand the work to which they are committed, managing our nation’s range and wildlife and preserving our rich ranching tradition. A historic gift of this nature reflects a tremendous vision and spirit of philanthropy and we are incredibly grateful,” stated President of Texas A&M University-Kingsville, Dr. Mark A. Hussey.

This partnership will allow students pursuing a master’s degree through KRIRM the opportunity to conduct real-world case studies on land and animal management, including brush control, grazing management, livestock management, wildlife management and marketing. The investment of cash will establish an operations and management endowment that enables KRIRM to manage the ranch to support teaching, applied research, and outreach to ranching industry stakeholders according to the KRIRM mission. A portion of the planned gift will support the Veterinary Technology program at Texas A&M-Kingsville and provide scholarships for students attending veterinary school.

Texas A&M-Kingsville publicly launched its *With You. Without Limits.* campaign in April 2018. With this planned gift, donors have generously given \$94.6 million, nearing the campaign goal of \$100 million in private support. The university has recorded more than 19,000 gifts from more than 4,600 donors since the campaign’s inception, with each gift securing our university’s future while preserving and honoring its unique heritage as an integral part in the success of South Texas.

“On behalf of the Board of Trustees of Texas A&M-Kingsville Foundation, we are ecstatic about this donor’s investment in the university, and specifically the King Ranch® Institute for Ranch Management,” said Brad Walker, Vice President for Institutional Advancement and Foundation CEO. “We know that Texas A&M-Kingsville is without limits, but to achieve the university’s mission, it really does take the support of individual donors and alumni.
