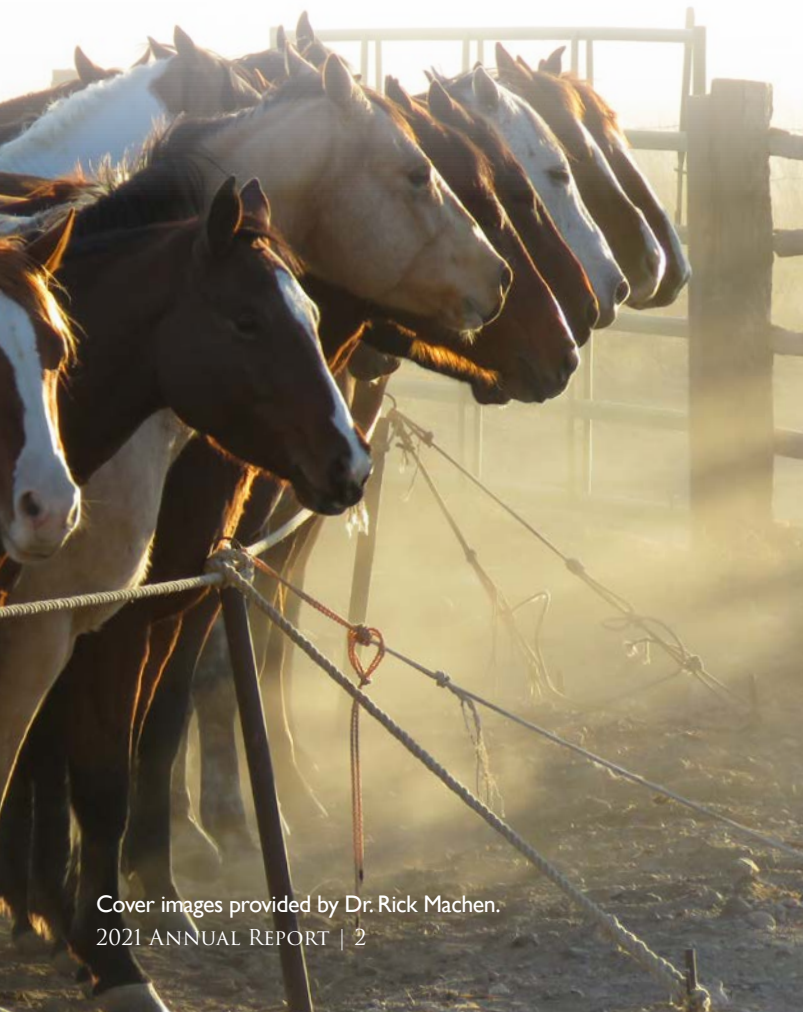

A MESSAGE FROM THE CEO & CHAIR OF THE BOARD

Four years ago, the Texas A&M University-Kingsville Foundation announced the first comprehensive capital campaign in the history of our university. The goal of our campaign, *With You. Without Limits. The Campaign for Texas A&M University-Kingsville*, was to raise \$100 million. We were confident that you, our donors, would accept the challenge and invest in our students and university as we worked toward this ambitious goal. Never did we anticipate the remarkable, continuous outpouring of support that came from our donor base throughout the campaign.

On August 31, 2021, we celebrated an astoundingly successful campaign. Through your generosity, we recorded the largest single-gift commitment in the history of our institution at \$19.5 million. We also received \$23 million in planned gift pledges, surpassed the campaign's goal 20 months ahead of schedule and saw our endowment reach new heights after stellar investment performance.

The culmination of our first ever capital campaign was an important and historic milestone in the 50-year history of the TAMUK Foundation. Since its first meeting in the office of the mayor of Laredo in March 1972, the Foundation worked tirelessly to achieve the vision of uniting the generosity of our alumni and supporters to significantly enhance the financial support available to our students, professors and university. We have never wavered in our objective of supporting the mission of Texas A&M University-Kingsville, as it works to better South Texas, our state and nation.

With your support and generosity, we continue that pursuit today, and this is reflected in the pages of this annual report. The focus of our Foundation trustees and staff in the year ahead will be to express our gratitude and thank every generous donor who has invested in our university in recent years.

As most of you know, our university leadership is transitioning as we bid farewell to Dr. Mark Hussey and thank him for his leadership, vision and support. We welcome our new president, Dr. Robert Vela, Jr. '94, '98, '03, who comes to TAMUK after a very successful tenure as president of San Antonio College. We look forward to matching donor support with his leadership to further the university mission to "enrich lives through education, discovery, and service in South Texas and beyond."

There is one thing that you have proven: With you, Texas A&M University-Kingsville – its students, researchers, instructors, programs... indeed, every part of our university – is without limits.

TEXAS A&M-KINGSVILLE RANKS IN TOP TEN BEST PUBLIC UNIVERSITIES BY ALUMNI STARTING SALARY

When it comes to starting salaries for graduates, Texas A&M University-Kingsville is ranked seventh in the state among public universities.

PayScale's College Salary Report ranks Texas colleges by alumni salary earnings. This list includes salary data for alumni whose highest degree was a bachelor's degree.

The list recognized Texas A&M University-Kingsville as an engineering and research state university with about 40 percent of degrees awarded in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) fields.

According to data, Texas A&M-Kingsville alumni with less than five years of experience earn an average of \$57,300 and \$104,800 for those with more than 10 years of experience.

"The PayScale ranking is further validation of what I hear from our alumni all the time – that their degree has had a direct impact on their success. Our students today can look forward to joining a wonderful network of alumni after graduating," said Brad Walker, Vice President of Institutional Advancement and External Relations and CEO of the Texas A&M-Kingsville Foundation.

The data also shows 63 percent of A&M-Kingsville alumni say their work makes the world a better place.

"Texas A&M University-Kingsville is an amazing launch pad for our graduates. Having faculty, staff and community partners work together to support our students sets them up well for career success," said Ralph Leal, Director of Career Services and Corporate Relations. "Our university's ranking is a testament to our students' hard work and determination, which make them key contributors to employers and society through their determination and character."

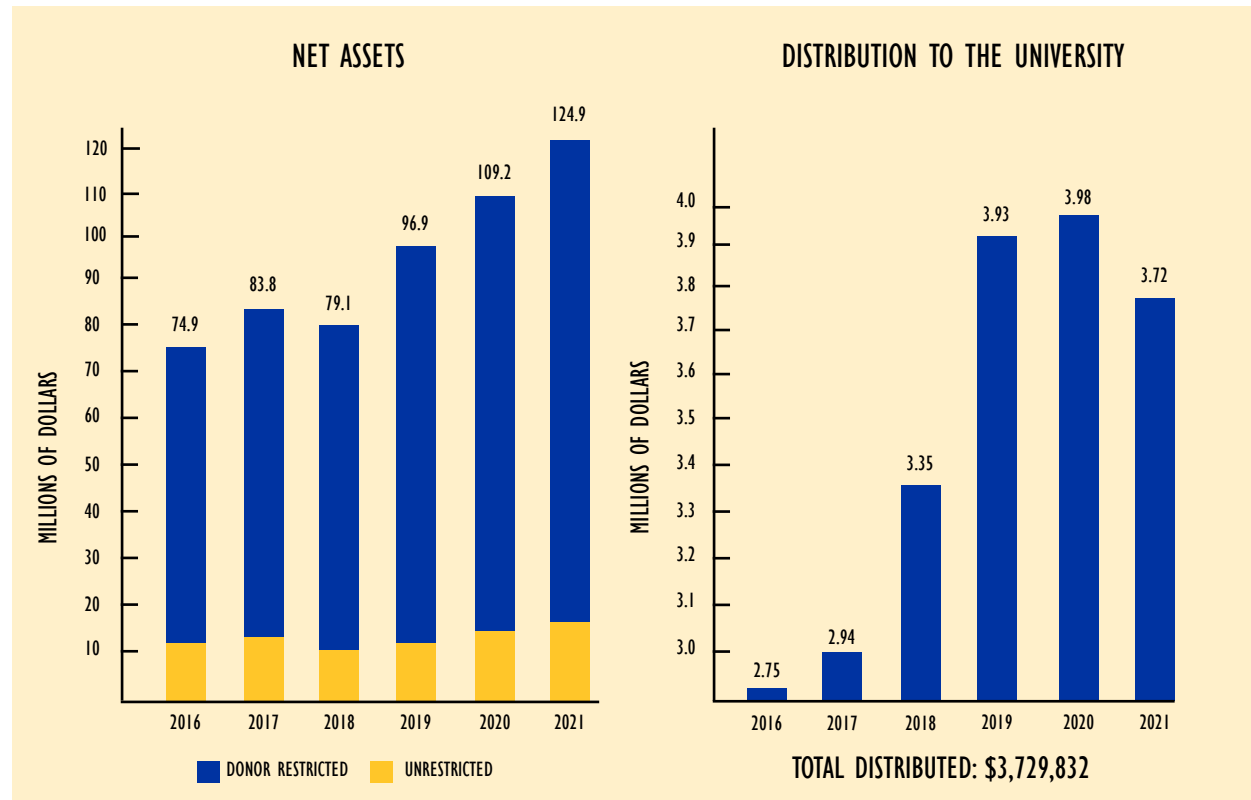

The Texas A&M University-Kingsville Foundation hosted its second annual Javelina Day of Giving on Sept. 15, 2021. The one-day fundraising event drew participation from more than 1,100 students, parents, alumni, faculty, staff and friends; over \$430,000 in support of Texas A&M-Kingsville.

Throughout the day, gifts flooded in from across the country; 27 states were represented. Alumni giving spanned a total of 76 class years – the oldest class gift reported from a member of the Class of 1949 and the youngest belonging to a student expected to graduate in 2025.

“We all know there is tremendous pride among the Javelina community, but the response to our second Day of Giving was almost overwhelming,” stated Brad Walker, Foundation CEO.

“It was humbling to see the support coming in from all over the country, and a great feeling to know the impact these gifts have on our programs and the lives of our students.”

Every college within Texas A&M University-Kingsville was represented; with over 13 campus initiatives impacted by the generosity of donors. Standout gifts include nearly \$200,000 given toward Javelina Athletics and a major commitment from Dorothy and Tom Shockley establishing the Javelina Educators Program.

With You. Without Limits. The Campaign for Texas A&M University-Kingsville concluded with overwhelming success August 31, 2021, having raised \$114,073,541.

Some of the funds received by the campaign are already at work enhancing A&M-Kingsville, updating buildings and labs on campus, and adding to scholarship funds available for students through endowments.

The Texas A&M University-Kingsville Foundation kicked off the comprehensive capital campaign in April 2018 with a goal to raise \$100 million to support the university and its mission to enrich lives through education, discovery, and service in South Texas and beyond. In January of 2020, the goal was met, 20 months ahead of schedule.

Overall, the campaign received more than 6,000 gifts, with over 3,400 supporters making their first-ever gift to the university. The donor that contributed most to the campaign was the Caesar Kleberg Foundation for Wildlife Conservation which gave \$22.7M to the Caesar Kleberg Wildlife Research Institute.

The largest singular gift of the campaign was \$19.5M in real estate and cash committed by an anonymous donor to the university's renowned King Ranch® Institute for Ranch Management.

TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY-KINGSVILLE FOUNDATION CELEBRATES 50 YEARS OF SERVICE



Forty-six years after President Robert B. Cousins welcomed the first students of today's Texas A&M University-Kingsville to their first day of classes, a small group of loyal and optimistic school donors met to ensure its success into the future.

On December 20, 1971, Joseph C. Martin Jr., Mayor of Laredo, Larry A. McNeil, a 1948 alumnus and oil and gas businessman from Corpus Christi, and Dr. James C. Jernigan, president of Texas A&I University in Kingsville, acquired a Certificate of Incorporation from the State of Texas creating the Texas A&I Development Foundation, a nonprofit organization with the sole purpose of supporting the educational efforts of Texas A&I University in perpetuity.


The first organizational meeting was held shortly thereafter, on March 9, 1972, at which the three founders, serving also as the first trustees, unanimously adopted the new organization's by-laws. In keeping with those by-laws, Martin, who was then president of the Board of Directors of Texas A&I University, automatically became chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Foundation. McNeil was elected vice chairman, and Dr. Jernigan was elected secretary-treasurer.

Chairman Martin then appointed six additional trustees, two from the board of the university, two from the general citizenry of the South Texas region, and two others with demonstrated commitment to the success of Texas A&I.

The \$4,700 endowment of the already existing Texas A&I Development Fund was donated to establish the bank account for the new Foundation, and the by-laws clearly laid out the mission and challenge of those original nine trustees of the Texas A&I University Foundation: they were to seek additional assets to increase the endowment in support of the educational mission of Texas A&I University.

Over the following 50 years, the membership of the Board of Trustees has risen to nineteen members, with four emeritus members and two ex-officio members. Collectively, over these 50 years, the trustees have served with distinction, increasing the assets of today's Texas A&M University-Kingsville Foundation to more than \$124 million.

Jerome M. Tymrak Memorial Scholarship Endowment

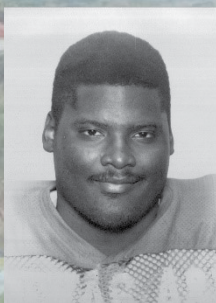


Retired faculty member and beloved teacher Jerome Tymrak '69, '77 lived out his passion for agricultural education in many of his vocations.

establish the Moses J. Horn, Jr. '88 Memorial Scholarship

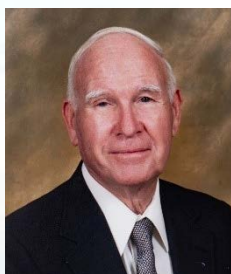
